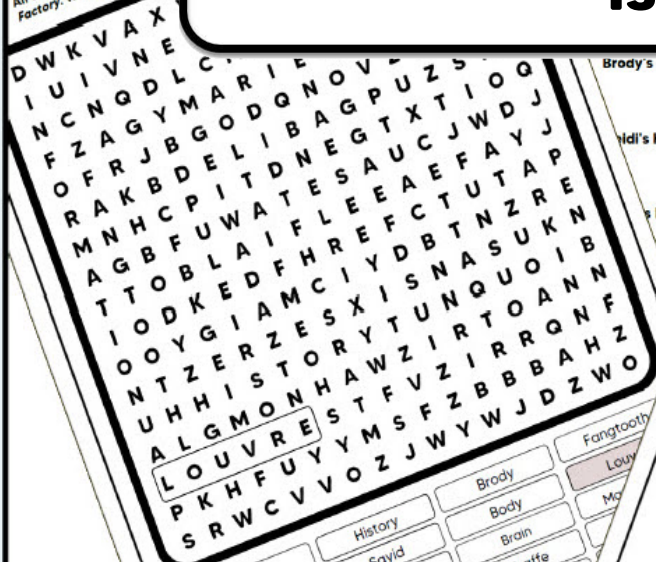

## Westlife Put a Stamp on 25 Years

Twenty-five years in the music business is a pretty impressive achivement – and not one reeched by many pop bands. But Irish group Westlife have dun just that.

To mark the miletone, An Post has released a set of comemorative stamps featuring all four members – Nicky Byrne, Kian Egan, Mark Feehily and Shane Filan.

Speeking to RTÉ Radio 1's Liveline, Kian Egan admitted he didn't realise how special it was until his mum rang him. 'It's not until your mother is ringing you up going "Oh my God, I can't belive you're on a stamp!" that you realise how special it all is,' he said.

Over the past two and a half decades, Westlife have enjoyed huge success, inlcuding 14 UK number-one singles, 55 million record sales worldwide, two Brit Awards and even a Guinness World Record for six consecutive UK number-one singles. They were also inducted into the Irish Music Association Hall of Fame.

The full stamp collection is available online and in post offices nationwide.

**Flashy Fact:** Westlife were originly called Westside – until they discovered another band had the same name.

### Rare Albino Pudu Deer Spotted

Tiny, shy and utturly adorable – pudu deer are amonge the world's cutest creatures.

Standing at just 50 cm tall when fully grown, they live in the South American countrys of Chile and Argentina but are rearly seen.

But a group of tourists in Chile's Tepuhueico Park recintly had a rare encounter when they spotted an albino pudu deer. They named the little animal Blanquito, which means 'little white one' in Spanish.

Albinism occurs when an animal produces little or no melanen, leaving its fur wite and its eyes pink. This can make it harder for it to see and easier to fall prey to predators.

Luckily for Blanquito, Chiloé Island – where he was spotted – has very few predators, giving pudu deer a better chance of survival.

**Flashy Fact:** Pudu deer are nocturnel and usually live alone, hiding away from predators.
